Standing on the promises that cannot fail, When the howling storms of doubt and fear assail.


By the living Word of God I shall prevail, Standing on the promises of God.





He did what you and I need to do when everything seems to go against us and nobody seems to understand or encourage us.. "David encouraged himself in the LORD his God."





How do I encourage myself in the Lord? By standing upon the promises of God! Let's look at a few of these wonderful promises of God.
