Dear Friends,

Do you know what is the best anaesthetic for a troubled heart? It is found in the comforting words of the Lord Jesus in John 14. "Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in Me." When the Lord Jesus spoke these words the hearts of the Lord's disciples were very troubled. They had just heard the Lord tell them three very disturbing things: First, one of them would betray Him; second, He was going to be with them only a little while; and third, Peter was going to deny the Lord three times. Their hearts were deeply troubled. How much they needed to hear those comforting words from the Lord Jesus. "Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in

Me." As another has written and I quote: "How precious it is to note that the Lord did not say "hearts," but "heart"; It means that His loving comfort is for each individual heart.





Is your heart troubled today? Have you let the events in the world trouble your heart? It is hard not to have troubled hearts when we read of young people bringing guns to school and hear so much about the increasing violence and unrest in the world. We are truly living in the perilous times described in the 2nd epistle of Paul to Timothy. Almost every newspaper or news broadcast reports some, if not all, of the nineteen things mentioned in 2 Timothy 3:1-5.

Is your heart troubled about things in your personal life? It could be things in your family or things at your place of employment. In all of these things the Lord still says to us today, "Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in Me."

We need to be reminded that our Savior is still on the throne and He is in control. Nothing happens or takes place without His permission. The hymn writer, Paul Gerhardt put it so well in the following words:

We leave it to Himself

There is a wonderful day coming for this world when the Lord Jesus will rule this world in power and righteousness for a thousand years. It is described for us in the Old Testament. See Isaiah 2:1-5; 11:9; 65:17-20. But until that day comes God moves behind the scenes to accomplish all His purposes.

Is your heart troubled today? The Lord Jesus has *left* something for us and also *gives* something to us

that will keep us from having troubled hearts. "Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." John 14:27.

The peace He has left with us refers to His finished work on the cross. He has made peace through the blood of His cross and being justified by faith we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Colossians1:20; Romans 5:1. The peace He would give me daily comes from casting all my care upon Him knowing that He cares about me. 1 Peter 5:7.

Again I ask you, dear reader, Is your heart troubled today? "Take your burden to the Lord and leave it there." The Lord Jesus really cares about you and wants you to cast all your care upon Him.

If you do that you will be able to enjoy the "peace that passeth understanding." You will find "perfect peace" in the midst of the storms and contrary winds that you will encounter in your life.
