Dear Friends.

In the two verses at the beginning of this issue of ON EAGLES' WINGS we find something we are not to cast away and we find something we are to cast away. Sometimes we seem to get mixed up on these two things. We cast away our confidence and carry all our care!

We are not to cast away our confidence. The Hebrew Christians had been going through some very hard times. Their confidence had been somewhat shaken by the departure of some professed Christians from the faith. But we are not to cast away our confidence in the Lord even when things seem dark and unexplainable. God is still in control and nothing can take place that He does not allow. The hymn writer has put it so well when he wrote: "God every where hath sway, and all things serve His might; His every act pure blessing is. His path unsullied light."

The apostle reminds these Hebrew Christians of those happy days after they had first trusted in Christ as their personal Savior. They had endured many afflictions and had been publicly mocked and insulted. They





had lost their property but accepted all of this joyfully. Why? Because they knew that they had "in heaven a better possession that could never be taken away from them. They were exhorted to "Cast not away therefore your confidence, which hath great recompense of reward. For you have need of patience (or endurance), that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise, for yet a little while, and He that shall will come, and will not tarry." Hebrews 10:35-37.

Are there things that are happening today in our lives and in the world that could shake our confidence in the Lord? The terrible tragedies that took place in New York and in Washington D.C. have brought fear, loss, shock, terror and a feeling of helplessness to many people. But the Lord says to us today. "Be not afraid of sudden fear, neither of the desolation of the wicked, when it cometh. For the Lord shall be thy confidence, and shall keep thy foot from being taken." Proverbs 3:25,26. "In the fear of the Lord is strong confidence, and his children shall have a place of refuge." Proverbs 14:26. "For thus saith the Lord God, the Holy One of Israel: In returning and rest ye shall be saved; in quietness and confidence shall be your strength." Isaiah 30:15

No! Nothing should shake our confidence in the Lord! He is the Same. He will never fail us nor for-sake us. Hebrews 13:8.

But even the very hairs of your head are all numbered: ye are of more value than many sparrows." Luke 12:6,7. Oh, how much He cares for us!

So when we are going through trials, great or small, let us remember to cast our burden upon the Lord. He will sustain us. Psalm 55:22. In these

perilous times may God give each of us to never cast away our confidence and to always cast all our care upon Him!
