Dear Friends,

Faith, Hope, Love. What wonderful truths these three words suggest to us! If we are to live a life that will be fulfilling and satisfying, all three of these virtues need to be present in our lives. More than that we will be able to honor and glorify the Lord Jesus. I would like to look at Faith in this issue and then in future issues the next two virtues, the Lord willing.

We often place faith in a person who has demonstrated that they always keep their word. When they say that they are going to do something you can count on them to do it. Much more is it true with our God and Father. We read in Numbers 23:19 that "God is not a man, that He should lie; neither the son of man, that He should repent: Hath He said, and shall He not do it? or hath He spoken, and shall He not make it good?" Faith in God, then, is really faith in the trustworthiness of God. Faith is simply believing that what God has said is true because it is God who has said it.

Where does faith come from? The Bible tells us that "Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God." Romans 10:17. Faith that faith in faith itself but faith in the;

Facts of scripture The fact of Christ's death The fact of His resurrection. Scripture tells us that Christ died for our sins. True faith accepts that fact and then believes in Christ as Lord and Savior. "For by grace are we saved through faith and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God". Ephesians 2:8,9. We are also justified (declared righteous) by faith. Romans 5:1. Two things always go together in salvation. They are repentance toward God and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ. Acts 20:21.

The Bible records that "The word is near thee, in thy mouth, and in thy heart: that is, *the word of faith*, which we preach; that if thou shalt confess with thy mouth Jesus as Lord, and shalt believe in thine heart that God has raised Him from among the dead, thou shalt be saved." Romans 10:9.

In 2 Corinthians 5: 7 we are reminded that we are also to walk by faith. "Faith is the handle by which I can take God's great and precious promises and apply them to my particular problems". 2 Peter 1:4. Two of those precious promises are given to us in Isaiah 41:13 and Hebrews 13:5.6.

Faith follows Christ's example allowing God to straighten the record when false things have been said about us or done to us. See 1 Peter 2:24 and Romans 12:19-21.

Faith trusts God when financial resources are running low and we wonder how we will be able to meet expenses. "But my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:19.

When I am discouraged and upset faith will help me to remember that I am "accepted in the Beloved." Ephesians 1:6. The love wherewith He loves the Son, such is His love to me. "God sees my Savior and then He sees me In the Beloved, accepted and free."

Faith gives thanks to God in all things—even in those things that may upset us. "In everything give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you." 1 Thessalonians 5:18.

Faith is able to commit a loved one's problems to God to resolve. "Casting all your care upon Him; for He careth for you." 1 Peter 5:7.

Faith recognizes that "Our times are in His Hands, Whatever they may be. Pleasing or painful, dark or bright as best may seem to Him." Psalm 31:15.

Faith claims God's strength to accept and endure weariness, pain and decline—patiently. "And He said unto me, "My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness." 2 Corinthians 12:9

How is faith developed? Through hardship, failure loss and disappointments. 1 Peter 1:7.

As we meditate upon what **faith in God** can do in our lives we have to say to the Lord with the apostles, "Increase our faith." Luke 17:5.
