

When darkness seems to vail His face I rest on His unchanging grace: In ev'ry high and stormy gale, My anchor holds within the vail!



Dear Friends,

Faith, Hope, Love. What wonderful truths these three words suggest to us! If we are to live a life that will be fulfilling and satisfying all three of these virtues need to be present in our lives. In a previous issue we looked at faith. Let's look at hope in this issue and then in a future issue at love.

Hope. We usually hear the word "hope" being used or even may use it ourselves with a remark such as "I hope so" without any good basis for expecting fulfillment. In the Bible hope is based upon the promises of God. And God will always

do what He says He will do as we read in Numbers 23:19. "God *is* not a man, that He should lie: neither the son of man, that He should repent: Hath He said, and shall He not do it? Or hath He spoken, and shall He not



make it good?" Mr. Vine's Expository Dictionary Of Old and New Testament Words records that "hope" as used in the Bible is a "favorable and confident expectation. It has to do with the unseen and the future."

God is the Author of hope. He is the God of Hope and is able to fill us with all joy and peace in believing. Romans 15:13.

The Holy Spirit is the power of Hope. We can abound in hope through the power of the Holy Spirit. Romans 15:13. What does God, the Holy Spirit, use to make us abound in hope?

The Word of God is what the Holy Spirit will use to produce that hope in us ."For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope." Romans 15:4.

How important it is, then, for us to search the scriptures daily. It is as we read and study the Bible that our hope will be strengthened and increased.

Hope is also produced in us by tribulation.

Although we never look forward to trials yet it is through trials that we learn to know God better. The following hymn suggests to us the ways that trials can be used by God to foster hope:

Yes, tribulation, worketh patience; and patience, experience; and experience, **hope**: and hope maketh not ashamed because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us:" Romans 5:3-5.:

Here are a few more of the different hopes mentioned in the Bible.

"But let us who are of the day, be sober, putting on the breastplate of **faith and love; and for an helmet, the hope of salvation."** 1 Thes. 5:8. The salvation that is mentioned here is the salvation from the *presence* of sin. The believer in the Lord Jesus Christ has been saved from the *penalty* of sin through Christ's death. Every believer in Christ can experience salvation from the *power* of sin by daily walking close to the Lord. But when the Lord Jesus descends from heaven and gives that 'shout' every believer in Christ will be caught up to meet the Lord in the air. We will then be saved from the very *presence* of sin. 1 Thessalonians 4:16,17.

In Romans 8:23-25 we read of another hope. That is the wonderful hope of being with the Lord and like Him. We are "waiting –for the redemption of our body. For we are saved by hope (or in the power of this hope) but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man sees, why doth he yet hope for? But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it." "We shall be like Him for we shall see Him as He is." 1 John 3:2.
